Research on the persistence of the crusade – in theory and practice – into and beyond the fifteenth century is flourishing. Capitalizing on this broad interest, and in particular on the **Leverhulme Trust's International Network** entitled 'Reconfiguring the Crusade in the Fifteenth Century: Goals, Agencies and Resonances' (PI: Norman Housley), the Accademia di Romania is hosting a workshop at which speakers will address salient features of crusading in relation to the powers of the Italian peninsula, with an emphasis on the roles played by the Papacy and Venice.
